Students will be trained monitor patients accounts through insurance billing, and third party payers such as Medicaid, Medicare, Tricar, Workers' Comp and more.

Student schedules may vary, while some classes may be offered at different times throughout the year at night, certain classes are not offered on an evening schedule. All classes are offered through online/eLearning during the course of the academic year.
